## Starting at our setting

The first few days

We want your child to feel happy and safe with us. We offer 2 settling in sessions before your child starts, to give them an opportunity to get to know the setting and the staff. If your child requires more time to settle, we will work with you to agree a plan which fits the needs of your child. Your child will be assigned a keyperson who will work directly with your child and family to support their settling and future learning.

## Funding

We accept government funding for 2 and 3 year olds, for either 15 or 30 hours depending on your eligibility.

We also accept childcare vouchers.

## Policies

Copies of our policies are available for you to read through at any time. These are available in written form within the setting or on the website.

The setting's policies help us to make sure that we provide a service of high quality and that being part of the setting is an enjoyable and beneficial experience for each child and his/her parents/carer. The staff and committee work together to adopt the policies and take part in reviewing the policies on a regular basis. This review helps us to make sure that the policies are enabling the setting to provide a quality service for its families and the local community.

#### How parents take part in the setting

Our setting recognises parents/carers as the first and most important educators of their children; staff at Ducklings see themselves as partners with parents in providing education and care for their child. There are many ways in which parents can involve themselves with the setting such as:-

- Exchanging information on their child's needs, interests, and progress with the staff.
- Using Tapestry to share achievements.
- Sharing their own interests and skills with the children.
- Helping to provide, make and look after equipment and materials used in the children's play.
- Taking part in events within the preschool and attend informal discussions about their child.
- Being part of the committee and attending meetings.
- Building friendships with other parents in the setting.

# **Our Values**

Education and care are of equal importance and through the experiences and opportunities we offer the children in our setting, we are able to ensure:

- An inclusive environment for all
- Children feel valued
- Children are safe
- Children gain social skills and thrive on new experiences
- Children value learning and the opportunities this offers

## **Our Sessions**

Within our sessions our children are able to choose from a variety of different activities, which ultimately aid their development and support them in making good choices. They are encouraged and supported through any difficulties they may have and are set challenging but achievable learning priorities. The children are involved in free play, as well as Adult Led activities both in small or larger groups. Introducing them to new experiences and enhance their developing skills.

## **Play and Assessment**

Children learn best through play, this is how they make sense of the world around them.

We use the early years foundation stage guidance to plan activities both adult led and child initiated, covering both breadth and depth of the curriculum.

We assess children's learning and development by observing them and planning appropriately to make progress towards the next stage in their development.

We monitor the wellbeing and involvement of every child to ensure all activities are engaging and the children display positive attitudes to learning.

## Clothing

We encourage children to gain skills that help them to be independent and look after themselves; these include taking themselves to the toilet and taking off and putting on outdoor clothes. Clothing that is easy for them to manage will help them achieve this. If your child is not yet toilet trained, please provide nappies and wipes.

We access the garden throughout the sessions regardless of the weather, so your child will need, Wellies and a waterproof coat, as well as a sun hat and sun lotion applied (when needed)

#### Attendance

We believe it is important for children to have prompt and regular attendance and ask that if your child is absent for any reason you inform the setting by telephone on the first day of absence. Please be aware if your child is absent you will still be charged for each session.

#### **Snack Time**

At Ducklings we offer both a morning and afternoon snack. The snack sessions are run on a rolling basis across the session and allows children to decide independently when they are hungry and ready for their snack. The children are offered milk or water and our snack menu is designed considering the Healthy Early Years guidelines. Please tell us about your child's dietary needs and we will make sure that these are met.

On occasions we do have food tasting as part of our knowledge and understanding of the world, learning about different cultures, before these occasions we will send a letter out detailing the foods that will be offered.

Water is available throughout the day/session using the child's named water bottle that you provide.

### The Key Person

At the setting you and your child will receive support from an experienced member of staff responsible for your child's needs, known as their Key Person.

Although the key person will be your main point of contact, all pre-school staff will be happy to feedback on your child's developmental progress on a daily basis or discuss any concerns with you.

They will maintain records on your child's progress and achievement, which are always available for you to see via the Tapestry online learning journey system and we encourage parents to contribute towards this from home.

Your child's Key Person will make time to find out from you about your child's interests, likes, dislikes and any special requirements. By sharing this information you can make sure that the preschool provides the most appropriate care and education for your child.

Children learn through their play, we provide a broad range of challenging, stimulating and fun play activities, both indoors & outdoors, that promote children's overall development.

Our aim is to support & develop each child to become secure, confident, imaginative & creative.
