

# Our Online Learning Code of Conduct - Working Together to Keep Everyone Safe

### When learning online at home...

#### • As a child I will:

- Use technology safely and sensibly
- Use websites that I have been directed to by my teacher or ones which my parents/carers have agreed are acceptable for me to use
- Not go on a website or download anything without permission from my parent
- o Inform an adult if I see something that upsets me
- Complete all learning to the best of my ability
- Not give out any of my personal information online
- o Be respectful to others
- o Ask for help or guidance if I need it
- Have fun, enjoy my learning and stay safe

### • As a parent I will:

- Monitor my child's internet use and check that they are using technology safely
- Check my online protection systems to ensure that time online is as safe as possible
- Check that my child understands the task that has been set. If not, I will give help and support where required
- o Make sure that my child has a comfortable place to sit to complete their learning
- o Ensure that my child has a suitable amount of time away from the screen during the day
- o Discuss my child's learning with them as appropriate

# When supporting children with Online Learning...

#### • As a staff member I will:

- Follow the school's safeguarding procedures at all times
- Remove any inappropriate posts and contact parent(s) regarding this
- Ensure the work I am setting is safely accessible for all children
- Ensure the tasks I am setting are well signposted online and that children are able to find them without difficulty
- Check websites prior to setting the work to be certain that these are safe and appropriate
- Be contactable via email / Teams during learning times to help parents and children with any difficulties they may encounter (NB: this might not be immediate if the teacher is supporting a group online as well as teaching in school)
- o Respond to children's work and provide them with feedback
- Respond sympathetically to parents who may be struggling to manage their child's remote learning as well as working from home
