Deanwood Nursery

Hello from Deanwood Nursery!
This term we have been fascinated by the Tom Fletcher series 'There's a

We have been focusing on our fine motor control this term. This means we



have done lots of mark making, manipulating playdough, and hand-eye coordination activities. In particular the children loved making cheerio towers on the spaghetti!

We have also enjoyed using the scissors. We have learnt how to keep our hands



safe when we carry them and use them. The children enjoyed snipping paper and cutting along the lines too.

Pine Class

Another exciting term in Pine Class! We have been completing our learning based on stories and the children's interests. We have enjoyed completing activities based on 'The Room on the Broom' and 'The Wizard and the Princess'. We especially enjoyed making our own potions for the wizard to use. We used a variety of ingredients such as spiders, unicorn diamonds and fairy dust. Our most recent story was 'Stickman' which related quite nicely to our Christmas topic. We had to complete lots of challenges for Stickman and had a lot of fun!

In phonics we have learnt all of the phase 2 phonemes and have been practicing sounding out and blending words. We have also looked at real and nonsense words and have played games based on this.

In maths, we have been learning in the phase of 'light and dark' and have been learning about numbers to 5. We have completed various activities surrounding these numbers.

Our Christmas show went incredibly well and we are all very proud of ourselves! It has been a great second term of learning and we are looking forward to a lovely Winter break!





Maple Class

This term, Maple Class have been learning about famous artists throughout history and have had a lot of fun creating their own artist inspired artwork!

In Science, we have been learning about scientists and inventors. We learnt about the inventors who invented Lego and zoos, and the scientists who discovered our senses and materials that keep us warm.

In Art we looked at the skills used in Art and Design. We have been introduced to sketchbooks and have filled these with lots artwork. We have printed with Lego, colour mixed to create shades of colour and used shapes to create our own pictures.

In English we have been looking at Moths and found out all about them and how they are different to butterflies! We had to read and follow instructions to make a Moth feeder. We then had a go at writing our own instructions to make porridge after reading Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

We have been very busy in Year 1 this term and we look forward to finding out what our new topic will be in the New Year. Have a lovely Christmas and stay safe Maple Class!

Oak Class

This term, our topic in Year 2 was 'The Great Fire of London'. We have enjoyed learning about life in 1666, how the great fire started, spread and stopped as well as what changed in London afterwards. It has been really interesting going back in time and realising just how different things were back then.

In Maths, we are now much more secure in our understanding of place value and have moved onto learning how to add and subtract numbers. We have also been spending more time on Times Tables Rockstars, securing our multiplication and division facts!

Our story 'The Dark' by Lemony Snicket left us all feeling a little bit scared in English but it led us onto some interesting pieces of work, including poetry, stories, descriptive writing, role play, persuasive writing, responding to music through art, story mapping, instructions and explanation writing. All of this and we are still practicing how to write in full sentences but we are now beginning to include commas, question marks, apostrophes and exclamation marks in our writing!

In Art, we created some amazing pictures of the 'Great Fire of London' using pastels for the fire and black paper to create a silhouette of the London skyline in 1666. We have also created some detailed pictures of King Charles II and Samuel Pepys.

Finally, we have been very busy preparing for the filming of the Christmas Nativity 'It's a Party'. We would like to say a big thank you to parents/carers for helping children to learn their lines and prepare for the show. Even though it won't be quite the same as usual this year, we are looking forward to you enjoying the show from the comfort of your home whilst snuggled up on the sofa with a cup of tea. We hope that you enjoy watching your child making some precious Christmas memories.



Cedar Class

What an interesting term we have had in Year 3! We have been continuing our journey through history moving from the Iron Age to the age of the Romans.

It has been interesting to read different books based within the Roman period such as Bacillus and the Beastly Bath which helped us learn the different types of baths the Romans used (even how they used to go to the toilet all in the same room!). We have also read the story of a Roman slave and about the Celts in Roman Britain.

We began our history lessons learning about Romulus and Remus and the legend of how Rome was founded – did you know it is said that Romulus killed his brother, Remus, and named the city after himself? As we learnt more about the Romans, we discovered they could be quite violent! They Roman army was legendary not to mention the Colosseum and its gladiators.

We did learn that it wasn't all swords and fighting for the Romans though, we also learnt about how many new innovations they brought to Britain, such as roads and bath houses. We also discovered that they created wonderful art



in the form of mosaics. In class, we had a go at creating our own mosaics – it's harder than it looks!

We are currently enjoying learning about the eruption at Pompeii and using the story 'Escape from Pompeii'

as inspiration for our own stories.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all the parents and carers who have supported us with our learning so far this year. We wish everyone a Merry Christmas and we look forward to seeing you all for a Happy New Year.

Willow Class

Year 4 have had a fun term learning about Ancient Egypt. We have spent time learning about Egyptian gods and goddesses, studying hieroglyphs and making our own cartouche out of clay and completing an information doublepage spread all about Tutankhamun! We also mummified Dave, our class mummy and some tomatoes (they really stink!)





In Science, we have been studying the digestive system and our teeth. We had a go at making our own toothpaste, labelling our digestive system and looking at what types of teeth we had. We made models of the mouth using mini marshmallows to do this!

We have been working really hard in DT this term and have made our own Egyptian Death Masks inspired by Tutankhamun's. We first designed them in our art books, then cut out the nemous using thick card, added papier mâché to thicken them up, then we painted them in our design. We had a lot of fun!





As the children may have told you, Miss Gannon is going to be leaving Willow Class at the end of this term. Willow Class have loved having Miss Gannon and they are going to be really sad that she has left. I would like to thank her for all the work she has done with the children.

Hawthorn Class

This term we have been learning all about global warming. We have been studying plastic pollution and waste. The children have been working towards creating items out of waste and turning them into reusable items such as clothing or everyday items. The end of term "Trash ion Show" is nearly upon us and the children's ideas are looking wonderful. In Maths, we started this term by studying addition and subtraction. The children worked hard with this and are now able to use column methods to add and subtract 5-digit numbers. Moving on from this, the children have learnt about factors, multiples, square numbers, cube numbers and also how to multiply and divide numbers by 10,100 and 1000.

In Science, we have been looking at living things. We have investigated the life cycles of insects and amphibians. Researched how plants and mammals reproduce and finally looked at different types of metamorphosis in some animals.

Hawthorn class have really enjoyed our DT project this term which has been creating a structure of a bridge. We have looked at many different bridge designs, beam, arch and truss. We then carried out an investigation to see which design of bridge would hold the most weight. From this we created a bridge made out of spaghetti before moving onto making our final design out of wood. All of the children realised that the truss bridge was one of the strongest designs with a triangular shape. We really have packed a lot of learning into this term and both I and Mrs Down hope that you have a wonderful Christmas and we look forward to seeing you in the New Year!



Elm Class

This term we have been studying Nelson Mandela. We read a fantastic biography about his life and then wrote our own one after using internet and reading skills to research about him. As part of our topic, we learnt about the Apartheid and how racial discrimination was rife in South African during the 1940s-80s. In fact, it didn't end until 1994! We discovered that Nelson Mandela became a civil rights activist, which closely linked to our school assemblies last term during Black History Month where we learnt about Rosa Parks . Once we had finished writing, we began to take pride in our work and publish it, so they can go up on display for everyone to see next term. The biographies which the children wrote were fantastic – it is clear they have learnt a lot about Nelson Mandela this term!



Lunchtime

What a lovely term we have had, the children have all been very excited with the run up to Christmas. On December 9th lunchtime was very special as it was our Christmas lunch. The children excitedly entered the Main hall with their lunches while Christmas music played and ate at decorated tables. This was the first time both Pine and Maple Classes had experienced this.

We have welcomed 3 new MDMS this term, Mrs Collier, Mrs Player and Mrs Jaffrey all of whom have settled into their new roles wonderfully.

I enjoyed seeing EYFS and KS1 preparing for their Christmas performances and getting excited to be on the stage, wearing their costumes. Whilst I know that it was disappointing that we were unable to invite parents in to watch, I would like to thank those parents who have taken the time to contact me personally to show their support for the school's decision. I really hope that those of you who have requested a copy of the DVD will enjoy being able to watch it with your children and families over the festive period.

A particular highlight for me was the school Christmas lunch which took place last week. There was a real sense of community amongst the whole school with the children enjoying sitting with their friends, wearing Christmas jumpers, eating a lovely Christmas dinner and listening to their favourite Christmas songs.
