Deanwood Nursery

Term 6 has been a fantastic!

Pine Class

What a great last term in Pine Class! We have been busy finishing off our learning for the year. Our topic this term was focussed on 'Minibeasts'. We thoroughly enjoyed going on a minibeast hunt around our school field. We found lots of exciting and beautiful bugs. Our outside area was transformed into a minibeast investigation lab. We enjoyed looking for different minibeasts in the environment, discovering where they live and looking at them closely with magnifying glasses. We also designed and created some bug houses in our outside area.

In phonics, we have been learning how to read different words in Phase 4. We have also been learning some new tricky words and have made great progress.

In maths, we have been learning how to double, halve and share quantities. We used a variety of objects to complete this. We have also been learning about odd and even numbers to 10. The children have worked really hard on this and should be really proud of themselves!

Overall, we have thoroughly enjoyed our time in Pine Class and we are looking forward to all of the adventures that await us in Year One. Enjoy your summer holidays!!





Maple Class

In term 6, Maple Class have enjoyed learning about Kings, Queens and Castles! We have focussed our writing on a story called 'The Queen's Hat'. The children used their prior

knowledge of London to enhance their writing. We had a lot of fun using our imaginations to plan and write our own story about The Queen.



In Science, we have been exploring everyday materials. We have identified different materials and have investigated their properties. This was extremely helpful in supporting us in our DT work as we have been looking at castles and planning what materials we would need to make our own.

In History, we have enjoyed looking at past and present Kings and Queens and comparing them. We took the momentum of the Jubilee and hit the ground running with this topic at the beginning of term – Maple Class were very knowledgeable about our current Queen! We were hooked on the mystery that surrounded King Richard III and we learnt some very interesting things about him. Some children even used him as a character in their stories.

In Maths, we have been enjoying practical topics such as fractions and geometry. The children learnt about quarter, half and whole, and learnt about the language used to describe different turns and positions. We finished with number and place value to 100 and got creative with our 100 squares!

Maple Class came to school dressed in rainbow colours to support our NHS and we had a great time during our very first sports day! We also had a fantastic time on the bouncy castle at our end of year party!

Oak Class

Oak Class have been learning all about 'Africa'. We have worked together to look at Kenya's rivers, mountains, currency and nature reserves. We have used compass directions to explain how to locate places on a map and explored the 'Big Five' by creating our own fact files.


In RE and PSHE, we have learnt about 'beginnings and endings' and 'growing and changing' respectively. We have explored how to mark or celebrate new beginnings such as Vaisakhi, the Sikh new year and Christian baptisms.

Our English lessons have enabled us to carry out some cross-curricular work regarding the topic of Africa as we read '*Lila and the Secret of Rain*'. Oak class have been remarkably busy writing descriptive pieces using expanded noun phrases, using inverted commas to write speech, role playing scenes from a text and using story maps to inform their own retelling of a familiar story.

Finally, the children have explored how to decompose a game to predict algorithms and have explored art through different mediums by using pastels, paints and shading techniques to produce African landscapes and animal silhouettes.

Thank you, once again, to all parents for your support through a year of growth and change. I wish everyone in Oak Class the best of luck in Year 3 and look forward to seeing how they transition successfully into KS2.
