Deanwood Nursery

This term, Deanwood nursery have been very busy exploring the topic 'Growth and Change'. It has been a fantastic opportunity to discuss life cycles, explore plants, get busy looking for minibeasts and recognise seasonal change as we move into Spring.

We have also been fortunate to see the changes taking place to our outside area and construction is underway. A huge thanks to our PTA for raising the funds to support with this amazing development!

Our amazing cohort have also practised learning a repertoire of songs, so feel free to continue singing I'm A Little Bean and Mary Mary Quite Contrary. On top of this, we have developed our expressive arts and design, as well as our understanding of the world with opportunities to explore spring playdough, look at a range of materials to enhance our artistic ideas and match baby animals to the adult version.

We were also incredibly busy this term celebrating World Book Week and Red Nose Day, so thank you to all of you that took part, you looked amazing and put a huge smile on our faces.



Pine Class

This term, Pine Class have been exploring the topic of 'Spring', and explored a wonderful story called 'Errol'. This has given us the opportunity to explore information books and increase our understanding of non-fiction. We have also looked closely at seed packets and the instructions written on them.

This was also a fantastic change for us to make links between our literacy and our understanding of the world when we explored where Errol lives and used google maps to explore our local area.

Pine Class have also been amazing at demonstrating their understanding of number bonds and our automaticity with this is phenomenal! We have been busy mathematicians comparing number, exploring 3D shapes and also using these produce patterns.

We have had a wonderful term, with opportunities to celebrate World Book Day, Red Nose Day, Easter and pancake day. I am looking forward to Term 5!



Maple Class

During term 4, Maple Class have enjoyed learning about London. We have learnt about the four countries of the UK in more detail and explored London landmarks.

We read 'Pink is for Boys' during reading week and discussed job roles, colours and hobbies. We sorted them based on if we thought they were designed for boys or girls. We painted a paper doll in our favourite colours and we wrote an acrostic poem

titled 'PINK'.

We dressed up as our favourite characters for World Book Day 2023.

We dressed up in red, something funny, or a Mr Men/Little Miss to support Red Nose Day 2023!



In science, we have learnt about the plants and animals in our local area. We have explored the school grounds and found lots of deciduous and evergreen trees. We have been bird watching and have made our own bird feeders out of toilet roll tubes, lard and bird seed.

Maple Class have enjoyed learning about vehicles that move in DT. We have discussed how wheels move, designed and built our own vehicles, and ended the term with a wacky race!

In English, we have been reading a book called "If all the world were...". This story has taught us a lot about the four seasons and has touched upon loss and remembering those dear to us, who may no longer be with us. We have spent lots of time writing in role – pretending to be the character within this story and trying to understand how she might be feeling, linking her experiences to that of our own.

Maple Class have worked hard this term in Maths as we have started to learn how to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. We have been learning about place value up to 50 and look forward to looking at even bigger numbers next term.

Oak Class

This term Oak Class have been learning all about the history of travel and transport. We have worked together to discover how the first car was engineered, as well as studying the ways in which transport has changed over tie from Viking longboats to the first railway locomotive and the Wright Brothers' invention of the aeroplane. In RE and PSHE, we have focused on rules and routines, as well as our rights and responsibilities, with an emphasis on ways we can be inclusive, considerate citizens. Our English lessons have enabled us to carry on these subjects through cross-curricular links to caring for our planet as we studied '10 Things I Can Do To Help My World'. Oak class have been remarkably busy writing persuasive letters to Mrs Wright about conservation, creating poems about protection and management of our planet, forming instructions on how to make bird feeders and using the internet to safely research charities and projects based on their own interests around saving our planet. Finally, the children had a lot of fun designing their own toys using recycled materials.

We have also been applying a lot of our maths knowledge in Computing as we used tallies and pictograms to record and interpret data. The website https://www.j2e.com/jit5#pictogram is a great resource if you wanted to practice at home, too.

Thank you to all parents for your support throughout a difficult term with the loss of Mr Slack. Your understanding and patience has made me even prouder to be a part of this community. Good luck with any SATs practice or revision over the holidays and enjoy a well-deserved break.

In maths this term we have learnt about percentages and algebra. We have just begun our topic learning



how to calculate the area and perimeter of triangles and quadrilaterals. Next term we will continue with area and perimeter and then move on to cover properties of shape.

In science, we have been learning about light. We plan on continuing with light for a few weeks next term too. So far, we have learnt that light travels in straight lines and seen how refraction works.

Next term Year 6 will be sitting their SATs tests between the 9th and 12th May. We have been busily preparing ourselves so we feel as ready as possible. Over the Easter holidays we will be setting targeted homework to support the areas they have struggled with in the last set of practice SATs.

We are looking forward to all the exciting opportunities terms 5 and 6 provide for Year 6!

This term we have also said goodbye to our MDMS Mrs Collier, we wish her all the best – she will be missed.


