CLASS NEWS - TERM 5

Deanwood Nursery

We have had a lovely term in Nursery learning about minibeasts! We have gone on more bug hunts than we can count!



A highlight of this term has been watching our very own caterpillars grow and eventually become butterflies! The children learnt about the life cycle of butterflies and thoroughly enjoyed watching the process.



When the butterflies were ready, we set them free in our garden which was very special!

With the weather improving, we are spending lots of time outside in our garden and enjoying lots of water play – particularly making potions using flower petals, glitter and paint! It's been a really fun term!



Pine Class

This term we have been learning about 'People Who Help Us'. We have met Police Officers, Nurses and Fire Officers. We have found out about their jobs by listening, asking questions and having hands on experiences. We have been inspired to think about helpful jobs we want to do when we grow up! We have also found out, how to keep safe, clean and healthy from our very kind visitors. After we had our visitors we drew and painted portraits of them. In Pine Class we have looked at X rays of bones and talked about how doctors use them. Pine Class have practiced cleaning our teeth and examined our own fingerprints! We found out we all have unique fingerprints.

During the festivals of Easter and Ramadan we discussed the celebrations that take place. In Literacy we have recited the story of 'The Little Red Hen' and written speech bubbles, story maps and our own versions of the story. We have used instruments to accompany our story when we retold it.


In Maths sessions this term some things we have investigated are: doubles; sharing equally and odd and even numbers.

Maple Class

During term 5, Maple Class have enjoyed learning about fairy tales. We had a fantastic time dressing up as our favourite fairy tale character and wrote a recount of the day.





Beanstalk', and 'Little Red Riding Hood', and used elements from the Writing Rainbow to enhance our writing.

In science, we have learnt about Invertebrates and vertebrates. We spoke about what an invertebrate and vertebrate is and how to identify them.

Maple Class have enjoyed learning about moving story books in DT. We have discussed how we could make objects and images move, and we have explored and built our own sliders. We designed

and made our own moving story books and plan to read them to Pine Class in term 6.

In PSHE, we have been thinking about taking care of things. We have spoken about our routines and how we keep ourselves



clean. We spoke about germs and how to stop them spreading. We made our own posters which were put up across the school to remind people to 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it'.



Maple Class have worked hard this term in Maths as we looked at weight, mass, volume and capacity. We have looked at multiplying and dividing, sharing and grouping.

Oak Class

During Term 5, the children have been thoroughly enjoying the engaging and humorous book The Man on the Moon, by Simon Bartram. This follows the life of Bob, a moon expert, who travels the 15 minutes each day to the moon, to maintain it and entertain the moon tourists. The children found lots of opportunities to write based on and around the story.

In PSHE, we have been learning about keeping clean and healthy. We learnt about the Scientist, Edward Jenner and the children were fascinated by the dramatization of the story of how and why he invented the vaccination to protect against Smallpox.

During Science lessons, the children have been investigating what is needed to successfully grow plants. They planted sunflower seeds in a variety of different conditions and waited. Apparently, keeping them in the dark, in a fridge and not watering them, doesn't work. Who knew?



A BIG thank you must go to the PTA for gifting all the children commemorative coins to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III. When the children came back to school after the event, the children brought in homework about the weekend. Some wrote recounts of what they had seen. Some had created collages of photos from the weekend newspapers and some brought in photos of how their friends and families had celebrated the occasion. One even made their own crown! All of them had plenty to say about their experiences. As I am sure you know, KS1 SATS can take place all through the month of May, but we worked with the children on these tests for the last two weeks, so that we could have them working in smaller groups, to make the tasks less daunting. They all worked very hard and these are all complete. They really deserve their Half Term break!



Cedar Class

It has been an incredibly busy and exciting term in Year 3!

In our writing, we have been looking at a book called 'Flood' which has no words as the story is told through images. We have been working on what the words might have said if there had been any! We are really enjoying the book and exploring a range of vocabulary in our writing.

In science, we have been looking at light and dark. We have considered how some objects can reflect light well whereas others do not. We are also exploring shadows, how they are made and how they can be manipulated.

In maths we have worked incredibly hard on fractions! They can be a bit tricky at times, but all of Year 3 have tried incredibly hard and made good progress with their understanding.



Of course, a main event this term has been celebrating King

Charles III's coronation.
We loved dressing in our smartest red, white and blue and



participating in a range of activities including imagining we were king or queen for a day and making our own crowns.

In Art, Year 4 have been learning that photography is also very much a form of art. The class used the IPads and took some beautiful photographs of the nature, just outside our classroom door. Back in the classroom, they used tools, such as 'filters, stickers, draw and paint', in the app, to manipulate the images and create new, artistic versions.

We look forward to lots more fun learning in Term 6. Have a lovely break.

In maths, we have been learning about fractions. This unit has been vast and the children have learnt to compare and order fractions, subtract and add fractions by an integer as well as converting mixed numbers to improper fractions.

In writing we have been mastering the technique of speech writing and the children will soon be experts in learning how to persuade and argue effectively.
