

Maple Class

This term, Maple Class have been learning about themselves. We have focussed our writing on the book 'Super Duper You' by Sophy Henn. We have written all about what makes us super-duper! We wrote about the people we live with. We have written about our favourite things. We have been busy using capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and adjectives. We also really enjoyed singing the alphabet song when learning our alphabet for GPaS!



In Science, we have been learning about parts of the body and our 5 senses. We investigated how we use these senses to understand the world around us. We have used our mouths to taste lots of different foods and we used our hands to find out what was in the box! We used our noses to match the scents and our ears to identify different sounds. We used our eyes to see what we could see on a walk around the school.

In Computing, we have been looking at technology around us. We have explored technology – electronic and non-electronic - and have even logged on to the computers in the ICT suite! We can now name and identify the main parts of a computer and have developed our mouse and keyboard skills. We now know how to use computers responsibly

We have been very busy in Year 1 this term learning all about ourselves and we are looking forward to finding out what our new topic will be next term.

Oak Class

This term Oak class have been learning all about dinosaurs, fossils and Mary Anning as part of their 'Dinosaurs' topic. We have looked at different dinosaurs from prehistoric periods, explored whether they were carnivores, herbivores or omnivores. During our English lessons, we have studied a text called 'The Adventures of Eggbox Dragon' and have designed, labelled and created our own Eggbox Dragons, role played scenes from the book and written letters to Eggbox Dragon to ask for his help with our own lost items.

Throughout our maths lessons, we have learnt all



about place value: identifying tens and ones, finding different ways to represent numbers to 100, comparing objects and ordering numbers, too. We will be moving on to our 2, 5 and 10-times tables when beginning our 'Addition and

Subtraction' unit, so please continue to support your child with Times Tables Rockstars so their automaticity of multiplications is successful.



Throughout our curriculum subjects, Oak class have continued to develop their artistic skills by exploring primary colours and how to

use these to create secondary colours. We have experimented with adding black and white to change the shade, considered how to create texture while painting and have made some beautiful collages. Throughout our science sessions, we have also looked at what makes us safe and happy, how exercise helps our bodies and what foods keep us healthy.

As we plan for our journey through Year 2, I ask that you continue to support your child with their phonics and reading by encouraging your child to read daily and to practice their spellings each week for Friday's spelling test. Thank you for all your amazing support and kindness this term, it has been a wonderful start to the year.

Cedar Class

Cedar class have settled really well into their routines and it is so lovely to have them back! We also wanted to thank you all for the wonderful home learning that has been carried out over this term. The children have returned to school very eager to learn.

This term, we have been learning about life in the Stone Age – pre gadget era. Needless to say, some of the children have been shocked to learn that they didn't have many of the luxuries which we enjoy today!

In Maths, we have been working hard to consolidate all our good mathematical learning on place value and addition and subtraction. We are learning how to use numbers up to 1,000. Next term, we will be continuing with addition and subtraction before moving onto multiplication and division. Specifically, we have introduced the children to column addition and subtraction which they are excelling in!

In addition to this, we have had lots of fun across the curriculum. We have been learning about networks in ICT; Diwali in RE; relationships in PHSE; and hockey in PE. The children particularly enjoyed the nappy experiments in science as well as learning about Stone Age jewellery art.





Thank you to all the parents that are continually offering support with homework, home reading, times tables and spellings practice. We can already see some incredible progress and the positive impact this is having with your children.

Willow Class

Well, what a good start to the academic year the children of Willow Class have had. They have fully embraced the challenge to tackle their times tables and begun battling on Times Tables Rockstars.

Please continue to support your children with this, not only is it a vital mathematical skill but also with the Multiplication Check coming



up in June 2024, it is crucial that the children can access this to the best of their abilities.


In Maths alongside the timestables, Year 4 has been revisiting Place Value and adding to their knowledge using numbers of 1000 and beyond.



The class have also travelled along Route 66 and virtually visited Las Vegas, learned about the past and present Presidents of the USA,

navigated the seas, following the trails of Christopher Columbus and written postcards, poems and diary accounts, linked to the topic.

In Guided Reading, Willow Class have been reading 'Mouse, Bird, Snake, Wolf' and using their inference skills, to express what may happen within the story. Furthermore, they have described characters and settings.



Art lessons have taken the class on an indigenous journey, exploring Totem poles and the meanings behind the bold, carved creations, mainly of North American animals. The process of creating a 2d design and transferring their ideas by manipulating media into a 3d version is always truly inspiring to be a part of.

Finally, the children have continued their recorder lessons within their Music lessons and have also been thoroughly enjoying hearing about musicians of the month in the singing assemblies.

September's musician was David Bowie.

Hawthorn Class

This term, our topic was Victorians. We had an amazing Victorians Day where the children dressed up and spent the day experiencing the delights and horrors of a typical Victorian school day. Mrs Smith and Mrs Cavell were both impressed by the fantastic costumes. In the morning, the children had the opportunity to taste gruel and listened to some Bible stories. The boys did a construction lesson whilst the girls made peg dolls. Behaviour was an important part of the day and a few of the children ended up wearing the dunce hat!! In the afternoon, the children got to make the traditional Victorian toy the thaumatrope. Our writing this term has also been based around the Victorians. The text was called Street Child. The children have seemed to have really

enjoyed reading it.

In Maths, we have covered place value and rounding numbers to a million. The children have learnt a little rhyme to help them with their rounding understanding. Please ask them to teach it to you.

In Science we have been learning about forces. We have been learning about gravity and air resistance. We made parachutes and then tested them to see which material would be the best for air resistance. To our surprise, it was the kitchen towel that won, so remember to always have some handy!

For PE, the children have been learning how to play basketball. Many games have been enjoyed and it has been nice to see their competitive side shine!

The children have worked hard this term, and it has been lovely getting to know them all. Have a wonderful half term and we can't wait to see you all after the holidays.


Maths this term has been all about place value. We have been concentrating on numbers up to ten million. We have been learning about short division and learning the most efficient methods for adding and subtracting.
